Good evening Chief Guest of this evening Dr.Priya Vasudevan, Madam Correspondent, invited guests, esteemed parents, well-wishers, members of the teaching and non-teaching faculty, and my dear students . It is a profound privilege to extend a warm and cordial welcome to all of you on the occasion of our Annual Day celebration. It gives me immense pleasure to present the Annual Report for the academic year 2025–26.

The academic year 2025–2026 has been a truly remarkable chapter at Chandrakanthi Public School, marked by noteworthy academic progress, outstanding co-curricular accomplishments, and an unwavering commitment to holistic development.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE:

For the Primary Grades (1–3), the academic year was organized into three terms, each consisting of two assessment cycles designed as fun and enrichment activities.

For Intermediate Grades (4-5), it was a three-term structure which included three Unit Tests and three Periodic Tests.

Open Houses after Periodic Tests enhanced parent-teacher collaboration and insight into students' academic progress.

Suggestions and feedback given by parents were taken seriously and acted upon.

CBSE is aligning with the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the National Curriculum Framework, with revised textbooks and changes to the examination pattern. As part of this shift, 50% of assessments will be competency-based. NEP 2020 encourages a move away from rote memorization toward competency-based learning, with annual assessments in these grades to measure conceptual understanding, application of knowledge, and higher-order thinking skills.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR AND CO-CURRICULAR ENRICHMENT:

ECAs (Grades 1-5): As a Weekly one-hour session activities such as Karate, Keyboard, Classical Music, Classical dance, Spell bee, Art & Craft and Tennis are conducted for grades 1 to 5.

WATER PLAY:

Grades 1 to 3 enjoy weekly water play led by a skilled swimming coach. This initiative aims at promoting physical fitness and water safety skills.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM:

Every class, from Montessori to Grade 8, actively participate in sustainable farming under the guidance of the Ko Desam team. This

hands-on initiative helps students cultivate environmental awareness and a strong sense of responsibility. Each class tends to its own plot of land in the CPS Agro Farm, generously provided by our Management. From preparing the soil and planting seeds or saplings to watering, adding compost or cow dung manure, monitoring plant growth, and finally harvesting, students are guided through every stage by the SD team.

This year, the children planted a variety of seeds, including palak, fenugreek, radish, coriander, agathi keerai, beans, gongura, and brinjal.

EDU SPORTS AND YOGA:

Regular sessions conducted by EduSports, our sports service provider, help deliver a structured sports curriculum that focuses on basic strength training and skill development across various team games. They are also readily available for feedback during all Open Houses.

Yoga, Music, Story Telling & Library are offered as CCA and help the students relax both body & mind and be happy individuals.

ASSEMBLIES:

The Class Assemblies were based on this year's theme—*Tapestry of Tradition*—presented by each grade and section providing an excellent platform for cultural awareness and meaningful knowledge sharing.

COUNSELLOR'S SUPPORT & GUIDANCE:

Our in-house counsellors, Ms. Bharani and Ms. Monika, conduct ongoing, well-structured guidance sessions for students from Grades 3 to 12, focusing on emotional well-being, adolescent transitions, behavioural awareness, digital responsibility, and academic planning. They also lead the CACA (Children Against Child Abuse) programme and provide personalized counselling support whenever needed.

DOCTOR'S TALK:

A series of health-awareness sessions conducted by our esteemed doctor-parents enriched our students with valuable insights on hygiene, wellness, eye care, dental care, diabetes, and adolescent health. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Pavithra Sriman, Dr. Kanimozhi, Dr. Vignesh, Dr. Kanchana Devi, Dr. Prithika, and Dr. Bhuvaneshwari for graciously taking the time to address our children.

WATER BELL:

To encourage everyone in school to drink water, music is played for a minute, after every one hour in both the blocks and water intake has improved considerably.

AFTERSCHOOL GUIDANCE CLASSES:

Afterschool Guidance classes have been arranged for students who need extra help from the teachers. Afterschool coaching classes for

Olympiad examination are also arranged for students who have signed up for the SOF exams. This year 40 students signed up for the English Olympiad, 53 students signed up for the Math Olympiad, 20 for the General Knowledge Olympiad, 17 for the Science Olympiad, 1 for the social Olympiad and 15 for computer science Olympiad. Coaching was given after school. All our students have done well and are awaiting results.

ENVIRONMENT DAY:

To commemorate the World Environment Day, our school celebrated the occasion on 13th June 2025 with the theme “Eco Warrior Fest” Each class selected an environmental activist—such as Sunderlal Bahuguna, Medha Patkar, Jadav Payeng, M.S. Swaminathan, S.P. Godrej, Dr. Rajendra Singh, Maneka Gandhi, Sumaira Abdulali, Jane Goodall, Al Gore, Karthikeya Sarabhai and Sharadchandra Pawar and conducted group activities including role play, poster making, story

writing, badge creation and model making inspired by their chosen Eco Hero. The displays were showcased in classrooms, and our distinguished guest, Ms. Sreedevi Ramesh, Co-Director of Bio Basics, visited to observe and interact with the students. Following her visit, students explored exhibits across other classes, fostering cross-class learning and deepening environmental awareness.

INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY:

International Yoga Day was observed at the school on 20th June 2025. Grade 4 students demonstrated simple yoga asanas and 7 *Chakras*. This was followed by a rhythmic yoga performance by students from Grades 1 to 5 and a meditation session led by Ms.Surya, the Yoga teacher.

COMPETITIONS:

The Rainbow Competition celebrated creativity across various topics like Join the dots & colour, Pot decoration, Flameless cooking, Story telling, Warli Art Painting , Fancy dress, Solo Singing, Solo dance, Pencil drawing, Dumb Charades and jewellery making using clay from Grades 1 to 5.

As part of Book Week, a range of literary competitions were conducted for Grades 1 to 5, including *Smart Writers*, *Read Aloud*, *Word Bloom*, *Tongue Twisters*, *Oratorical*, *Clothing and Adornment*,

and *Spell Bee*. Students participated enthusiastically, showcasing creativity while strengthening their imagination and literary skills.

Bharathiyar Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm, as students donned traditional Bharathiyar costumes and showcased their admiration through a variety of activities. They prepared and presented speeches, songs, poems, and a spell bee, reflecting their creativity, literary skills, and appreciation for the legendary poet's contributions.

SPECIAL CELEBRATIONS:

The school believes in strong family bonding and has been encouraging this in three special celebrations every year for the last 17 years. The Grand Parents' Day for Grade 1, the Mother's Day for Grade 2 and the Father's Day for Grade 3 are such celebrations which foster a better understanding between the child and the grandparents, the child and the mother and the child and the father respectively.

The 79th Independence Day was celebrated on the 15th August 2025, with Dr. Rukmani, General Physician at Ramvel Hospital, serving as the Chief Guest. Students presented an impressive programme depicting *Operation Sindhoor* and the *Uri Surgical Strike* through powerful songs, dances, speeches, and a compelling mime performance.

We also celebrated Krishna Jayanthi, Vinayagar Chaturthi, Onam, Diwali, Christmas, and Pongal during General Assemblies, where the entire school came together to participate in and enjoy the festivities.

PUPPET PARADE:

Students of Grade 1 to 5 participated in the Puppet Show Parade with great enthusiasm, depicting characters of their choice. With colourful and creative puppets in hand, they went around the school spreading joy and excitement. The lively parade not only showcased their imagination and talent but also filled the campus with cheer, laughter, and applause from teachers and peers.

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM:

Teachers have to upskill constantly to keep up with the changing world and so the Management ensures that the year starts with empowering the teachers through various skill development and Faculty Development programmes for 10 days in the month of May. Also, CBSE emphasises on a 50-hour training for each teacher every year and we enrol our teachers for appropriate training programmes offered by the CBSE through the year. Some are subject based, some are skill based and most are generalised topics. They also attend the various workshops and seminars organised by the Publishers and other education service providers.

SLEEP OVER:

The annual sleepover night is one of CPS's most hyped events. Students from Grades 5, 6, and 7 get a special "day away from home" experience that they look forward to every year. The fun activities like DIY activity, Colour Splash, Rock and roll, Story telling, Campfire and some exciting games, late-night movie, nonstop *chilling and vibing* with friends in their sleeping bags, and the awesome food keep them coming back until they finish Grade 7. An hour flew as they engaged watching and taking part in ventriloquism. This year, the event was held on the 1st and 2nd of November, and 110 students signed up and had an absolute blast.

MEDICAL CHECK-UP:

The annual medical check-up camp was conducted by doctors from PSG Hospitals from the 24th to the 27th of November. Following the examinations, the reports were sent home to parents.

FIELD TRIP:

Students from Grades 1 to 5 were taken on age-appropriate educational outings, allowing them to connect their experiences with classroom learning. It was a fun-filled day of exploration, collaboration, and sharing with friends, which also helped rejuvenate their spirits. The students prepare reports on their field trip experiences on their return. The destinations included: Grade 1 –

Traffic Park, Grade 2 – Insect Museum at TNAU, Grade 3 – NBNP, Grade 4 – A Farmhouse, and Grade 5 – The New Butterfly Park at Vellalore.

POSITIVE AFFIRMATION:

The CBSE directed all the schools to include positive affirmations in their daily morning assembly routines from the academic session 2025-2026. The purpose of this exercise was to support the socio-emotional development of students, to instil a positive and respectful school culture, to encourage self-reflection and emotional regulation and to help students start their day with clarity, calm, and confidence. This has been introduced and students repeat positive affirmations every morning.

AFTER SCHOOL SPORTS:

After school, one-hour coaching sessions are offered in Athletics, Football, Basketball, Volleyball and Skating for students of Grades 1 to 5.

The 11th Kiddies Meet was held on 18th July 2025, and was celebrated with great excitement and school spirit. The event began with a vibrant opening ceremony, followed by energetic performances, drills, dances, karate, and yoga displays by students across levels.
